Clearview Township Welcomes \$35 Million in Housing-Enabling Water Systems Funding from the Province

CLEARVIEW, ON January 28, 2024 – The Township of Clearview is delighted to receive a \$35 million Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund (HEWSF) Grant from the Province of Ontario. The funding will be used to construct the Klondike Park Road Well Site, Reservoir and Pumping Station, providing water infrastructure for 4,000 single-detached equivalency homes.
